RE: Disclosure Statement

This disclosure statement concerns information regarding the paper joint with Joshua Mitchell, "The New Lifecycle of Women's Employment: Disappearing Humps, Sagging Middles, Expanding Tops."

1. *Financial Support*: This work has been funded (in part) by the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation (Women Working Longer project) and by the Harvard Dean's Fund.
2. *Interested Parties*: Goldin has not received any financial support in the form of consulting or payments of any kinds. There are no known conflicts of interest with regard to financial support or of any other kind.
3. *Paid and Unpaid Positions*: Goldin is the Director of the NBER Development of the American Economy Program and receives a salary for the position.
4. *Review Rights*: The NBER requires that all output from the restricted access version of the HRS be approved before it leaves the secure data room. The approval mainly concerns the number of observations in each cell rather than the content of the work.
5. *Internal Review Board*: Goldin received permission to use a restricted access version of the Health and Retirement Study (HRS) through the NBER. IRB approval came from both Harvard University and NBER IRBs.
