(1) *Every submitted article must state the sources of financial support for the research it describes.*

This research was supported in part by NIH grants NICHD R01HD107079 and R01HD103666; Hong Kong RGC ECS Grant 9048312, and the China Development Research Foundation.

(2) *Each author of a submitted article must identify each interested party from whom he or she, or a close relative or partner, has received financial support summing to at least US\$10,000 in the past three years, in the form of consultant fees, retainers, grants and the like, or in kind support, such as providing access to data.
