

Disclosure statement for Philip Oreopoulos

Paper title: Long-run Effects from Comprehensive Student Support: Evidence from Pathways to Education

In 2017-18, the author was hired by Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC), a department of the Government of Canada, to conduct an evaluation of the Pathways to Education program at its Regent Park location. The author was paid a \$5,000 CAD consulting fee for this evaluation. The conclusions of that evaluation are based on the estimates in the tables and figures in “Long-run Effects from Comprehensive Student Support: Evidence from Pathways to Education”. The author also notes that part of the cost of linking the administrative data from the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) with the administrative files at Statistics Canada was borne by ESDC. At no time during this consulting relationship did ESDC request to review any results or findings prior to their release.
